I am very pleased to inform you that you have been accepted to the Yale Law School LL.M. degree program for the 1991-92 academic year. The Graduate Committee was extremely impressed with your excellent academic record and commitment to scholarship and teaching.

Yale Law School is an extraordinary community in which to study law. Our unmatched faculty-student ratio allows a vast array of courses in every area of law, an average class size under twenty students, and infinite opportunities for independent academic projects. Graduate students have a completely elective program and are encouraged to conduct independent research and writing under a faculty member's supervision.

The 1991-92 academic year opens officially on Tuesday, September 3, with school-wide orientation and registration. Classes begin on September 4. Course programs and information on academic and living arrangements will be sent to you in the spring if you decide to enter the program.


We estimate that your total expenses for the 1991-92 academic year will be approximately \$26,715, including tuition and fees, room and board, books, health coverage, and personal expenses. I am pleased to inform you that you have been granted a tuition fellowship in the amount of \$13,358 and a Convertible Loan* in the amount of \$8,000. If additional resources are obtained from the fellowship or other support for which you applied, some readjustment may be made in your award from Yale. If you need additional funds, we can also assist you with direct student or University loans (at the best available interest rate) of up to \$5,357.

I very much hope that you will accept our offer of admission. I would appreciate your notifying me of your decision by April 5. Please contact me if you need additional information or time to make your decision.

* Convertible Loan: In keeping with the LL.M. program's emphasis on promoting law teaching, a new form of financial aid is available to foreign graduate students. The loan money will be credited to the student's account and available for use during the 1991-92 academic year. The loan will be converted to a grant, and hence not repayable, upon the student's return home and completion of two years of law teaching.
